Important Information About Your Drinking Water

Town of Lake Placid Drinking Water Plants

SITUATION

The Town of Lake Placid public drinking water system failed to perform compliance monitoring for the Lead and Copper sampling for Magnolia and Sirena Water Systems, the required number of samples from residents was not met for sampling dates January to June 2024.

HEALTH EFFECTS

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During the sampling dates January to June 2024, we did not receive the required number of samples from residents and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water (with respect to these contaminants) during that time.

WHAT SHOULD CUSTOMERS DO?

Although this water system did not receive the required amount of samples during the sampling Dates January to June 2024, the results of the samples that were collected were within range of Department of Environmental Protection rules.

Customers need not take any action or seek an alternate water supply.

WHAT IS BEING DONE ?

The Town is now required to samples twice in a calendar year for Magnolia & Sirena Water System.

Tomoka Water System and Highway Park Water System were not affected and will be sampled as normal in 2024.
